The health and economic effect of COVID-19 has touched many, and particularly those already struggling to make ends meet.

The support of generous donors, businesses and philanthropic partners have made the following efforts possible in North Central Connecticut:

- **Funding for community agencies** to ensure that more than 2,000 people in North Central Connecticut received telehealth and counseling services; rent and utility assistance; and, material items such as food, toiletries, diapers and clothing.
- **Direct financial assistance** to more than 70 individuals who lost their jobs, were furloughed, or were experiencing other hardships in partnership with municipal social service directors;
- Financial coaching to help individuals navigate COVID-19 relief resources, manage debt and rebuild savings;
- **Distributing more than 2,500 face masks** to support nonprofit agency staff, teachers, community partners and clients;
- **Public awareness campaigns** on coronavirus health protocol, flu vaccinations and financial management services; and,
- Mobilizing volunteers in sending caring messages to essential workers and homebound seniors; virtual reading to children and STEM activities to youth; and safe, socially distanced support and food distributions and other community events.
