

#### Recognizing that September is National Preparedness Month, and the 20th anniversary of 9/11, United Way of Central and Northeastern Connecticut will engage 300 volunteers

between September 8th-11th in service and remembrance activities that support family

disaster and emergency planning. The project will serve as an opportunity to honor those who lost their lives or family members on September 11, 2001, and those who rose in service because of that tragedy.

To prepare families for emergencies, the kits will equip them with the knowledge and

tools to restock and have a plan to prepare and practice for emergencies. Volunteers will build Family Emergency Preparedness Kits with supplies (e.g., non-perishable snacks, flashlight, whistle, first-aid kit, wipes) and guidance for how to create and practice a disaster preparedness plan.




